We often report orders, requests, warnings, advice and invitation:



S + VERB + OBJECT +(NOT)TO- INFINITIVE



We often report offers, promises, and threats:



• S + VERB + TO-INFINITIVE



EXAMPLES:

- 1- "Can I help you?".
- She offered to help me.
- 2- "I'll be carefull".
- He promised to be carefull.
- 3- "I will hit you".
- The threatened to hit me.

• S+ Verb + Object +(not)To- infinitive.

• S + Verb+ (not) Ifinitive.
